### GYMKHANA AND GYMNASIUM

The college provides excellent sports infrastructure with three well-maintained playgrounds. These include a modern volleyball court, an advanced basketball court, a dedicated badminton hall, and a well-equipped gymnasium with modern fitness equipment. The institution has a proud tradition of outstanding achievements in sports at both state and national levels. Students are actively encouraged to participate in various sports activities and competitions at intercollegiate, university, state, and national levels. To nurture and develop sporting talent, the college appoints qualified coaches who provide systematic training to students, particularly in cricket, basketball, kabaddi, volleyball, and kho-kho. ## **PLACEMENT CELL**

The college is equipped with six well-maintained computer laboratories housing more than 200 computer terminals, supported by LAN connectivity and a central server facility. Computer access is extended across all departments, laboratories, the UGC Network Resource Centre, and the college office, ensuring efficient academic and administrative functioning. The Central Library is also equipped with dedicated computer terminals to facilitate digital access to resources and support students in their academic work. The institution continuously upgrades its IT infrastructure to meet evolving technological and educational needs.



## Co-curricular Activities

### **NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (N.S.S)**

The college has three units of N.S.S., and its activities are conducted throughout the year, including the 7-day residential camp. The NSS volunteers are enrolled in accordance with the university's guidelines. The N.S.S aims at creating awareness about social service and service to the nation, as well as national integration. ## DISCIPLINE AND CODE OF CONDUCT

Self-discipline is the best discipline. All students are expected to observe rules and regulations currently in force to enable the smooth working of the college. Students are prohibited from doing anything inside and outside the college that will interfere with its orderly administration or affect its public image. No outside influence, political or of any other type, should be brought to the college directly or indirectly.

### CODE OF CONDUCT

1. Students should always carry their valid college identity card whenever in the college or representing the college at other places. It must be produced for inspection on demand by any member of the college staff.
2. No students should loiter in the corridors or on the college campus during lecture hours.
3. Students should not bring any outsiders to the college campus without prior permission.
4. Students should not collect any funds from other students or from outsiders without the written permission of the Principal.
5. Students should not organize their own picnics, excursions, trips, etc., without the prior written permission of the Principal.
6. Students should attend their lectures in the divisions allotted to them and not in any other class or division.
7. Attendance: As per the University of Mumbai Ordinance 0.6086, students must maintain a minimum of 75% attendance in lectures, practicals, and tutorials. Failure to meet this requirement may result in the student being detained and rendered ineligible to appear for the University/College examinations.
8. Students should read the NOTICE BOARDS from time to time and be informed of the instructions/information displayed for their benefit.
9. Students should deposit any lost property found by them with the college office. Owners of lost property should claim the same from the office counter on the very next day.
10. Students are expected to maintain college property and contribute to keeping the campus clean and orderly. Any damage caused to college property shall be recovered from the concerned students.
11. Consumption of alcohol, smoking, chewing gutkha, and tobacco is strictly prohibited inside the college campus, including the canteen. Any student found violating this regulation shall be dealt with strictly.
12. Loitering in the corridors or sitting on steps or corners is strictly prohibited.
13. Students should refrain from using mobile phones in the college premises, as per circular issued by the University of Mumbai No. UG/552 of 2004 dated 31st December, 2004.
14. Dress Code: The formal dress code is mandatory for students of B. Com (Management Studies), BAF, and B.Voc. MLT faculties. Students of all other streams are expected to be in well-maintained formal attire and must come decently and properly dressed.
15. **Ragging Strictly Prohibited:** Ragging is strictly prohibited within the college premises and outside. In accordance with the regulations of the University Grants Commission (UGC) and the University of Mumbai, the institution maintains a zero-tolerance policy toward any act of ragging. Students must refrain from any behaviour that constitutes physical or psychological harassment. If an applicant or a student is found to have indulged in ragging in the past, or is noticed to have indulged in it during their tenure, they may be refused admission or summarily expelled from the college. Furthermore, the institution is legally obligated to lodge a First Information Report (FIR) against the offending student with the local police authorities. All students and parents are required to submit an undertaking affirming their compliance with these regulations at the time of admission.



## Admission 2026 - 2027

### FIRST YEAR (UG) CLASSES (2026-27)

- The college strictly follows the guidelines laid down by the University of Mumbai for admissions.
- The admission process commences with the sale of offline admission forms at the college.
- Admission to Undergraduate (UG) programmes is conducted through a mandatory online pre-admission registration system on the University of Mumbai portal.
- Applicants are required to register on the centralized admission portal at <https://muugadmission.samarth.edu.in/> by creating a login ID and password, and complete their profile by providing personal and academic details, along with selecting the programme of their choice. It is compulsory for all applicants to generate an **Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) ID or APAAR ID**, which is essential for admission and for maintaining academic records under the national framework.
- Candidates must submit the duly filled college admission form and University Pre-registration Form as per the prescribed procedure.
- The college releases merit lists in phases (First, Second, and Third Merit Lists) based on eligibility criteria.
- Selected candidates must complete **document verification** and **pay the prescribed fees** within the stipulated time, along with the necessary undertaking form.
- The college provides guidance and assistance to applicants for filling the pre-enrolment form, and no fees are charged for this service, ensuring a smooth and hassle-free admission process.
- The entire system ensures transparency, efficiency, and accessibility in admissions.
- The academic session begins with the commencement of classes and an orientation programme for newly admitted students.

(Circular No. No.UG/80 of 2010, Dated 27th April, 2010).

A candidate for being eligible for admission to the B.M.S. Degree Course shall have passed H.S.C. Examination of the Maharashtra Board of Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent examination or Diploma in any Engineering branches with two years or three years duration after S.S.C. conducted by the Board of Technical Education, Maharashtra State or its equivalent examination by securing minimum 45% marks for general category (in one attempt) at the respective Examination and minimum 40% marks for the reserved category (in one attempt).

No college shall conduct any entrance test in any form and the admissions are purely based on merit duly following the reservation policy as per the norms of Government of Maharashtra. While drawing the merit list, weightage has to be given to students from Arts, Commerce and Science Stream at 12th standard level. The stream wise weightage to be given is as under:

The applications are to be accepted and processed by the colleges stream-wise separately, and the merit list is to be displayed stream-wise, taking into account the reservation policy prescribed by the Government of Maharashtra.

- The merit list is to be prepared and displayed stream wise.
- In case no applications are received under the "Diploma in Engineering and other Category" or if the seats remain vacant in "Diploma in Engineering and other Category" after all the merit lists/ forms are exhausted, the vacant seats must be transferred to the Commerce Stream.
- In case no application is received from any stream, the vacant seats are to be distributed equally between the remaining two streams only.
- After the first merit list is displayed, if any seat allotted to one stream remains vacant, the same shall be distributed equally between the remaining two streams. In case of a vacancy in one stream is of single/odd number of seats, the single seat is to be allotted to the Commerce Stream. In case no applications are available from the two streams, then all the vacant seats of these two streams must be transferred to the third stream.

## REFUND OF FEES

- 1) *Rules for Refund of Fees: (According to Circular No. UG/114 of 2008, Dt. 27th January 2008) Ordinance No. 2859 Refund of Tuition, Development and all other fees after cancellation of Admissions.*

The candidates who have taken admission in aided and unaided courses conducted by affiliated colleges and in recognized Institutions may request for refund of fees after applying in writing for cancellation of their admission to the course. The refund of fees as applicable shall be made on or before 30th day after the date of cancellation. The percentage of fee for the course shall be refunded to the candidate after deducting charges as follows:

- 2) Refund of Deposits: Laboratory & library deposits (if any), will be refunded when a student leaves the college or cancels the admission. Deposits not claimed within one year of leaving the college / cancellation of admission will be forfeited.

Note: Students should note that, refund of fees will be paid by CHEQUE only.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS OF EXAMINATION:

### RULES FOR PROGRESSION IN UG & PG PROGRAMMES

( As per the University of Mumbai circular No.AAMS\_UGS/ICC/2025-2026/38 Date:28th May,2025.)

### Carry forward of marks in case of a learner who fails in the internal assessment and/or semester-end assessment in one or more subjects:

#### R – 1

1. A learner who PASSES in the Internal Examination but FAILS in the Semester End Examination of the course shall reappear for the Semester End Examination of that course. However, his/her marks on the Internal Examinations shall be carried over and he/she shall be entitled to the grade obtained by him/her on passing.
2. A learner who PASSES in the Semester End Examination but FAILS in the Internal Assessment of the course shall reappear for the Internal Examination of that course. However, his/her marks of the Semester End Examination shall be carried over and he/she shall be entitled for the grade obtained by him/her on passing.



### Progression rules (Allowed to keeping terms – ATKT):

R – 2

For UG programmes:

1. A learner shall be allowed to keep the term for Semester II irrespective of the number of courses of failure in Semester I.
2. A learner shall be allowed to keep the term for Semester III if he/she earns 32 or more cumulative credits from Semester I & Semester II.
3. A learner shall be allowed to keep the term for Semester IV irrespective of the number of courses of failure in Semester III.
4. A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester V if he/she earns 76 or more cumulative credits from Semester I, II, III & IV.
5. A learner shall be allowed to keep the term for Semester VI irrespective of the number of courses of failure in Semester V.
6. The result of Semester VI shall be withheld by the College till the learner passes all the Semesters from Semester I to Semester V.
7. A learner is allowed to take admission in Semester VII (UG Honours/PG Part I) only if he/she passed all courses of Semesters I to VI (132 Credits).

R – 3

For PG programmes:

1. A learner shall be allowed to keep the term for Semester II irrespective of the number of courses of failure in Semester I.
2. A learner shall be allowed to keep the term for Semester III if he/she earns 32 or more cumulative credits from Semester I & Semester II.
3. A learner shall be allowed to keep the term for Semester IV irrespective of the number of courses of failure in Semester III.

## LIBRARY RULES:

To maintain an environment conducive to study and research, all students are expected to adhere to the following library regulations:

### General Code of Conduct

- **Silence & Discipline:** Strict silence must be observed at all times. Group discussions are prohibited within the reading zones.
- **ID card:** A valid College Identity Card is mandatory for entry and must be produced whenever requested by the library staff.
- **Personal Belongings:** Bags, umbrellas, and opaque parcels must be kept at the designated property counter. The library is not responsible for the loss of personal valuables.
- **Prohibited Items:** Eating, drinking (except bottled water), and using mobile phones for calls are strictly forbidden inside the library.

### Library Attendance & Access Control

- **Electronic Attendance:** To maintain accurate records of library usage, every student must scan their barcode at the entry and exit points.

### Circulation and Borrowing

- **Membership:** Library privileges are non-transferable. Students must use their own library cards to borrow materials.
- **Borrow Period:** Books are typically issued for a period of **7 days**. Failure to return books on time will result in a daily overdue fine as per college policy.
- **Renewals:** Books may be renewed once, provided there are no prior reservations by other members.
- **Reference Material:** Reference books and current periodicals are for "In-House" use only and cannot be issued for home use.

### Care of Library Property

- **Damage Policy:** Students must inspect books before borrowing. Any damage, underlining, or tearing of pages found at the time of return will be the responsibility of the last borrower.
- **Replacement:** In case of loss or significant damage to a book, the student will be required to replace the latest edition of the book or pay the current market price plus a processing fee.

### Digital Library & E-Resources

- **Authorised Use:** Computers in the Digital Library section are to be used strictly for academic research and accessing e-journals.
- **Prohibitions:** Changing system settings, installing external software, or visiting unauthorized websites is a serious breach of discipline.



### Procedure for obtaining Duplicate Identity Card

In the event of loss or theft of the original Identity Card, students must follow the steps below to obtain a duplicate:

1. **Lodge an FIR:** Immediately report the loss of the original Identity Card at the nearest police station and obtain a copy of the **First Information Report (FIR)**.
2. **Submit Application:** Apply using the **prescribed form** available at the Library counter. The completed form must be submitted along with a copy of the FIR.
3. **Payment of Fine:** A processing fee of **Rs. 100/-** must be paid at the college office/cash counter. Please retain the payment receipt for verification.
4. **Issuance:** Once the application and payment are verified, the Duplicate Identity Card will be issued to the student within **8 working days**.

**Note:** The Identity Card is a vital document for campus security and library access. Students are advised to handle it with care. Using a found ID card belonging to another student or lending an ID card is a serious disciplinary offense.

**Integrated Barcoded ID:** Every student will be issued a barcoded Identity Card by the Library. This card serves as a for campus identity, attendance, and library transactions.

### Book Bank Facility

The college library offers a dedicated **Book Bank Facility** to support students from various categories by providing a set of essential textbooks for the entire semester.

This facility is available to students belonging to the following categories:

- 1) Book Bank Scheme for SC / ST / DT / NT (Supported by the University of Mumbai)
- 2) Book Bank Scheme for OBC (Other Backwards Classes)
- 3) Book Bank Scheme for EBC (Economically Backward Class)
- 4) Book Bank Scheme for Divyang (Students with Disabilities)
